
Regional average earnings per job are **\$28.4K below** the national average earnings of \$86.7K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2024 the region's population **declined by 0.9%** since 2019, falling by 3,305. Population is expected to **increase by 1.6%** between 2024 and 2029, adding 5,916.
- From 2019 to 2024, jobs **increased by 2.6%** in 12 Texas Counties from 125,825 to **129,125**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.3% by 1.7%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate increased from 50.2% to 52.9% between 2019 and 2024**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **10.7% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (10.8% below the national average), and **6.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.0% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2024 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.



May 2025 Labor Force Breakdown




Educational Attainment





Unemployment by Gender





Unemployment by Ethnicity






Job Trends
























Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration






Largest Occupations



Top Growing Occupations




Top Occupation Employment Concentration






