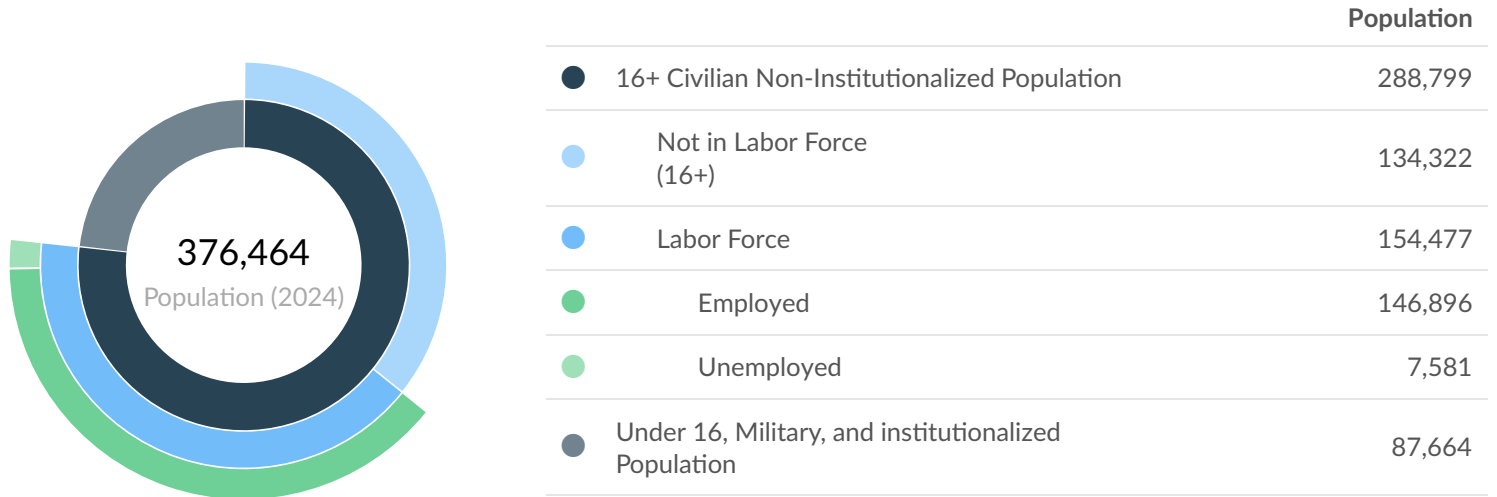
Regional average earnings per job are **\$25.5K below** the national average earnings of \$83.3K per job.

Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population **declined by 1.8%** since 2018, falling by 7,010. Population is expected to **increase by 0.1%** between 2023 and 2028, adding 246.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs **increased by 1.8%** in Deep East Texas Region from 125,744 to **128,025**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 4.3% by 2.5%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate increased from 51.7% to 52.4% between 2018 and 2023**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **10.7% of the selected regions' residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (10.4% below the national average), and **6.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.0% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Education and Hospitals (Local Government), Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.

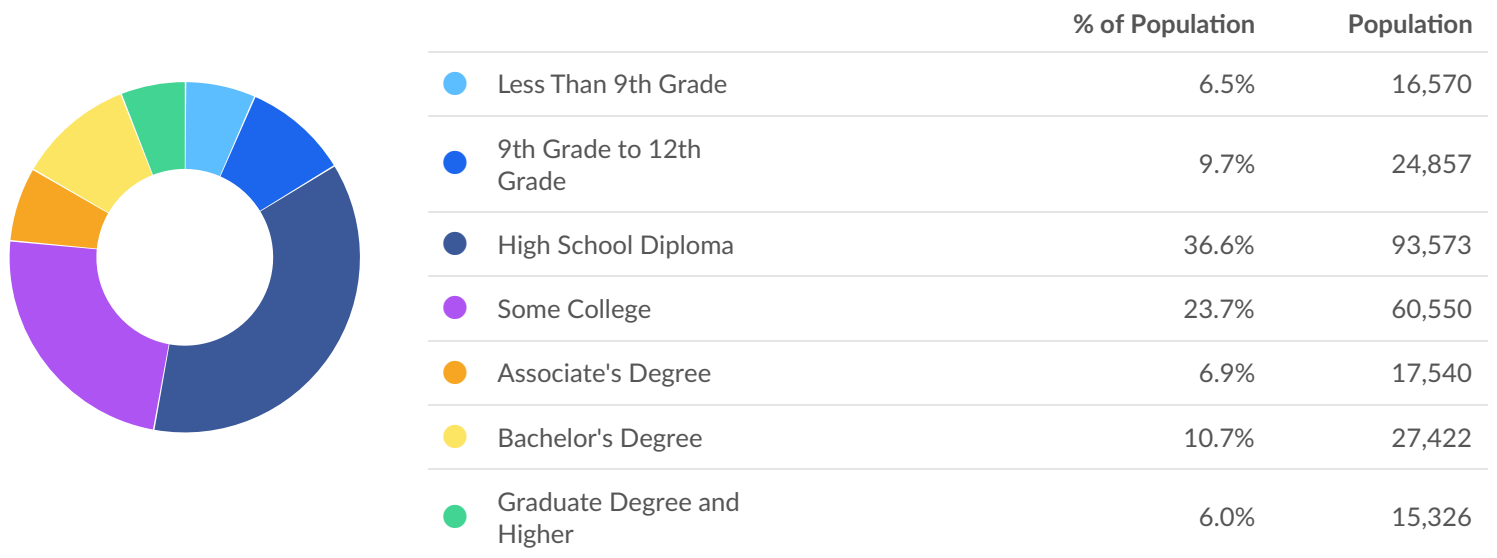

Mar 2024 Labor Force Breakdown



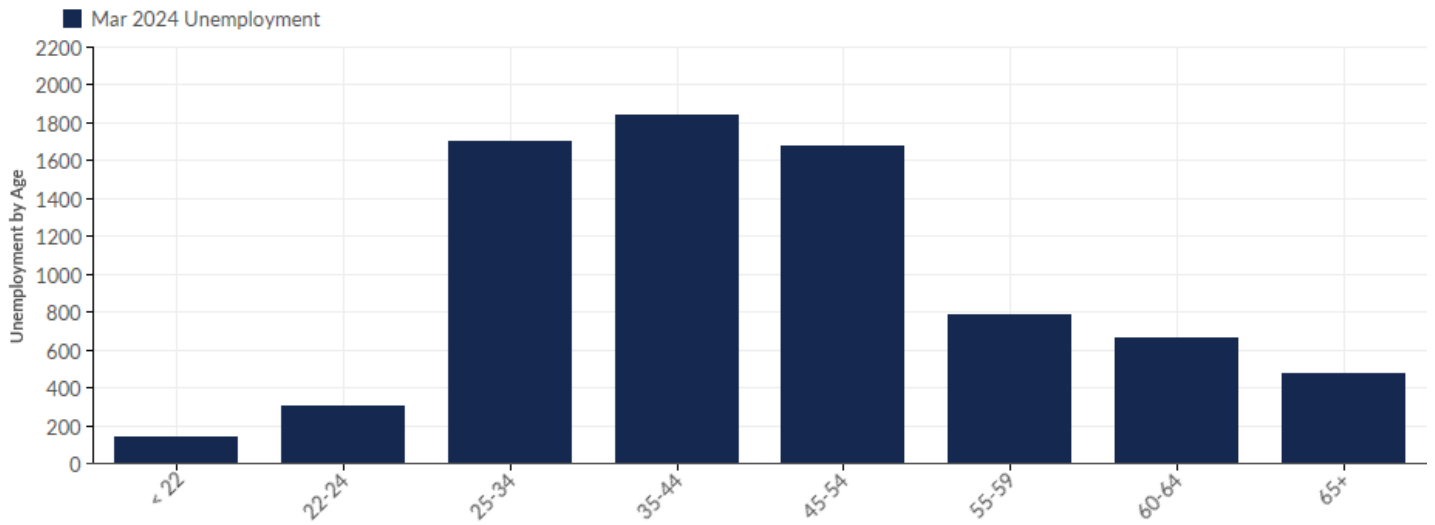
Educational Attainment

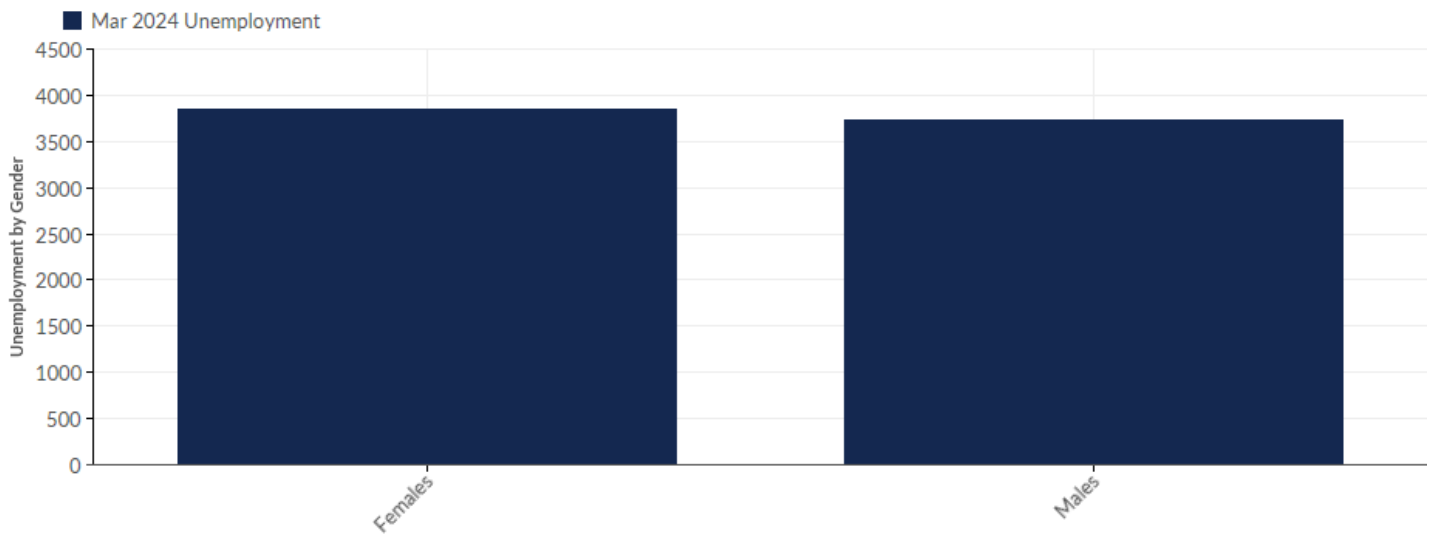

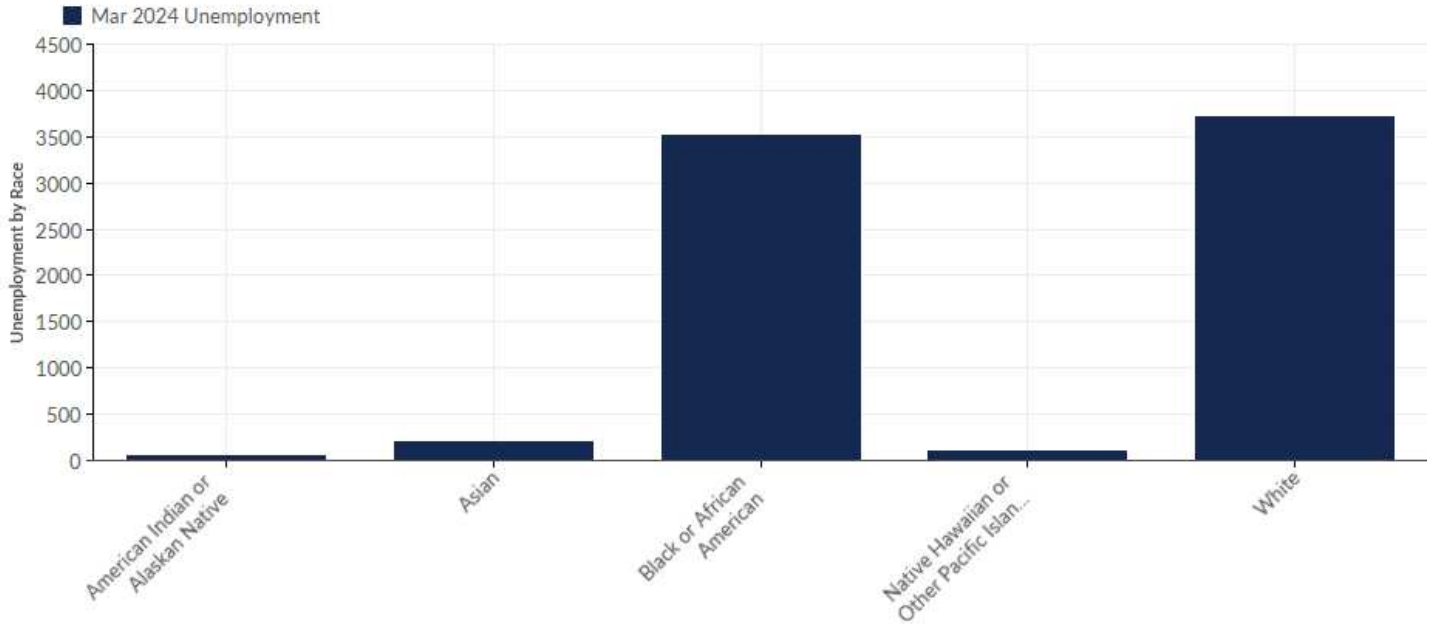

Unemployment by Gender



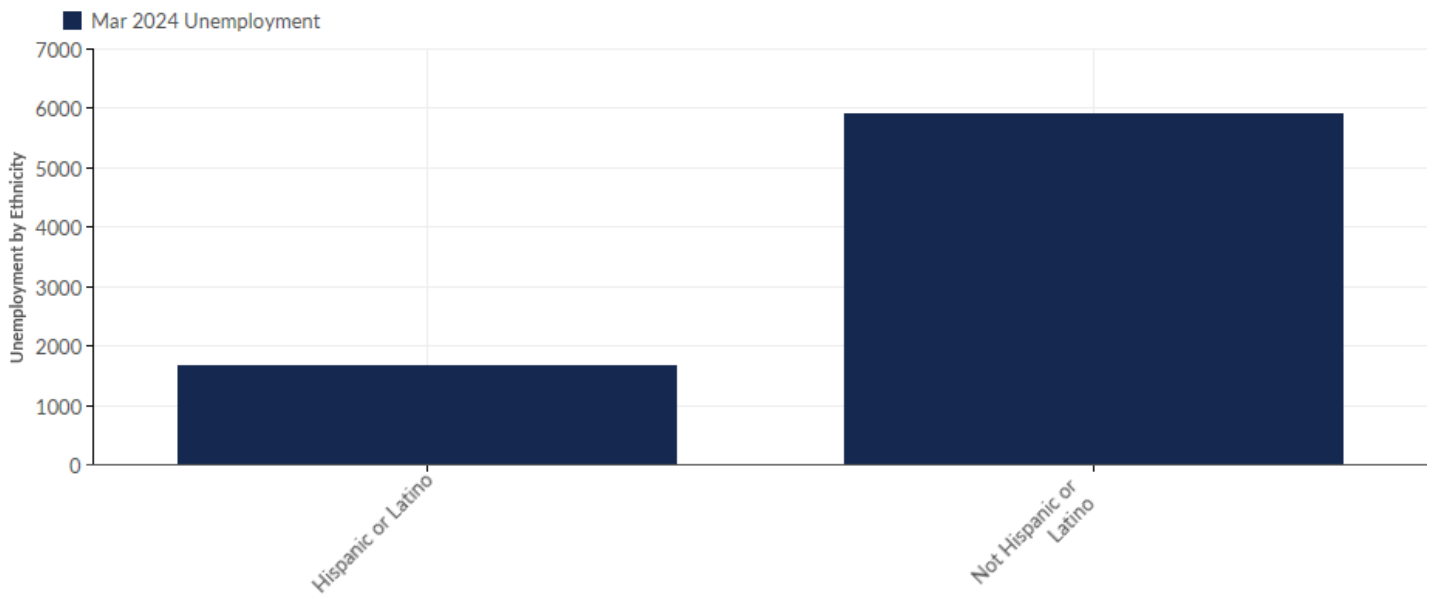

Unemployment by Ethnicity

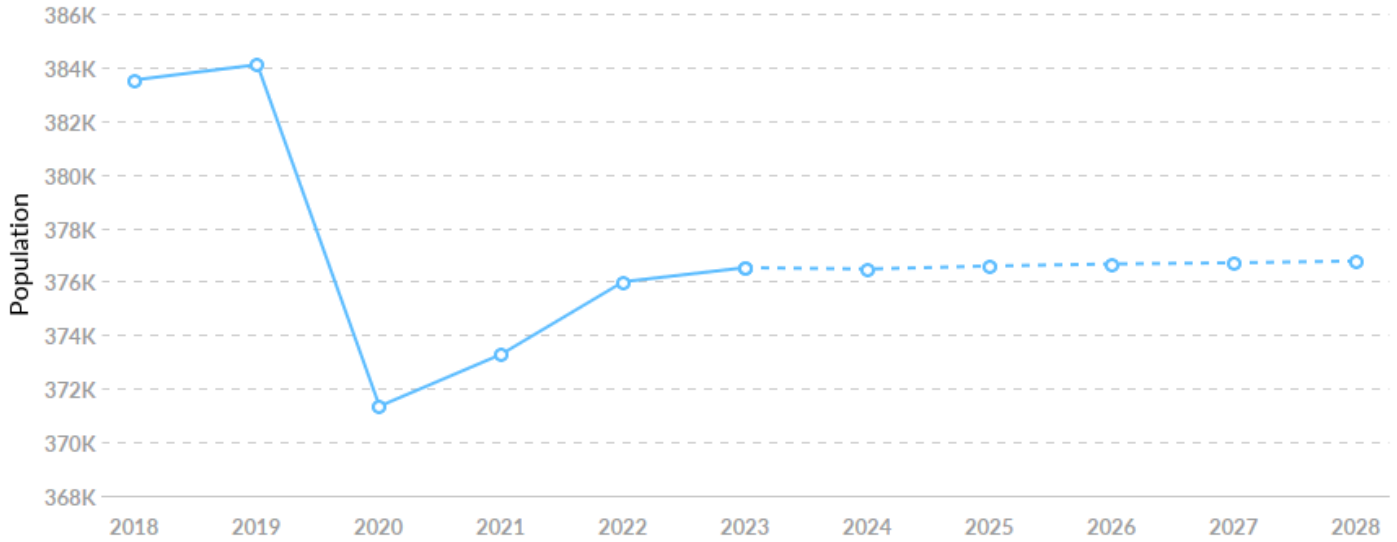

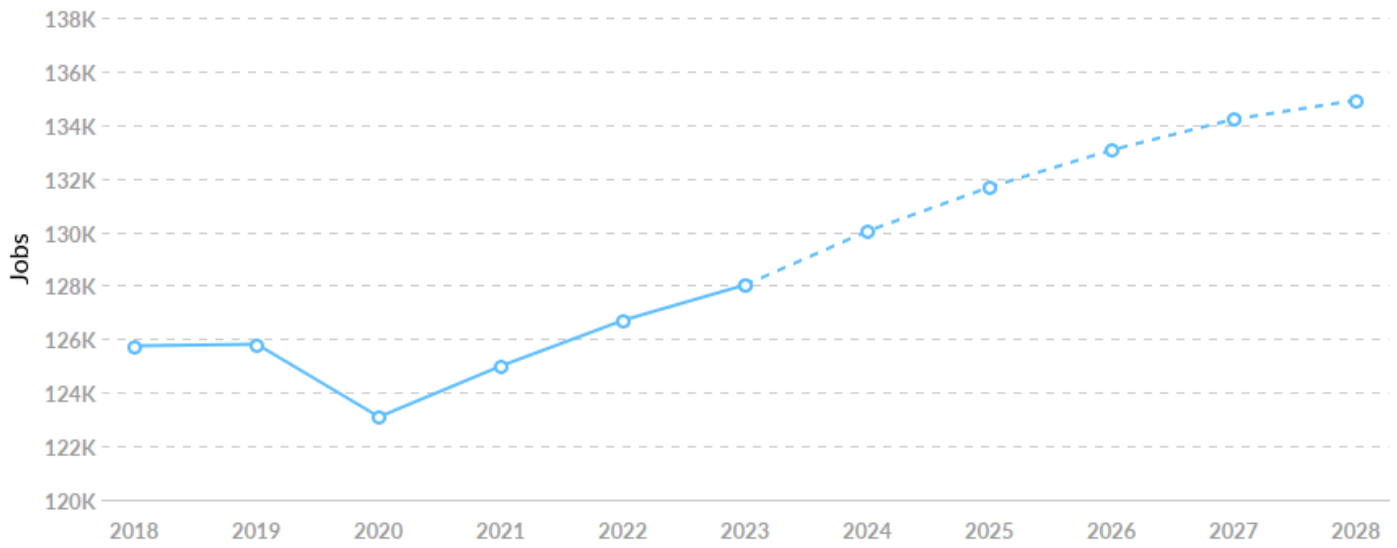

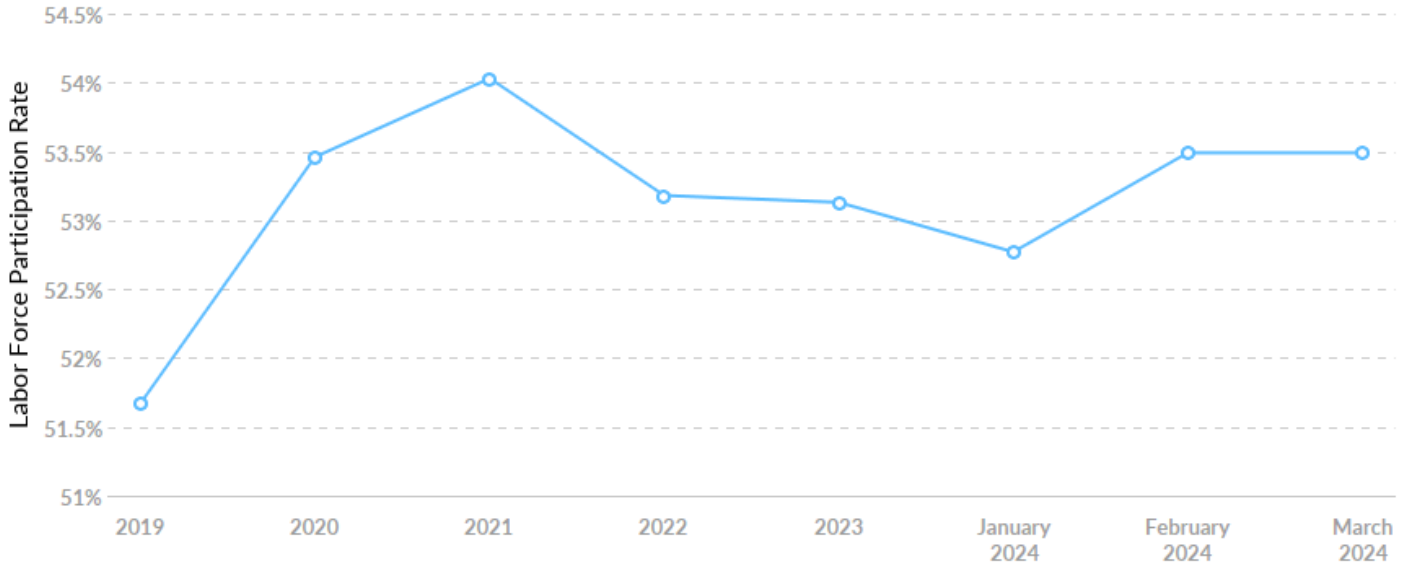
Job Trends

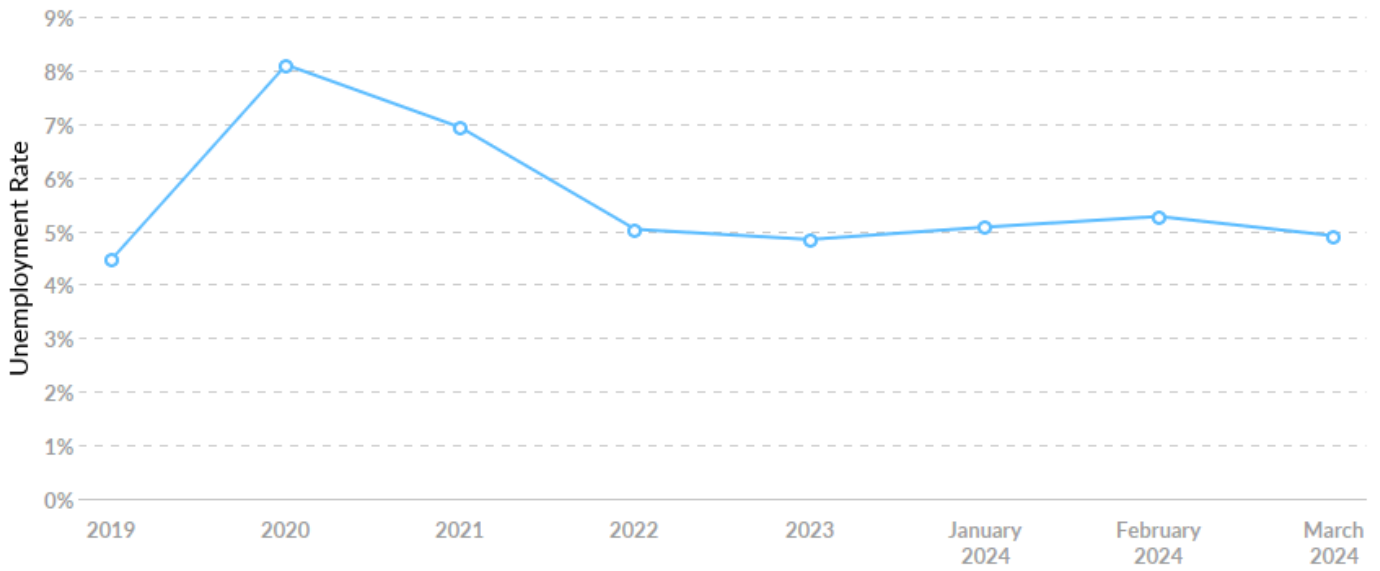

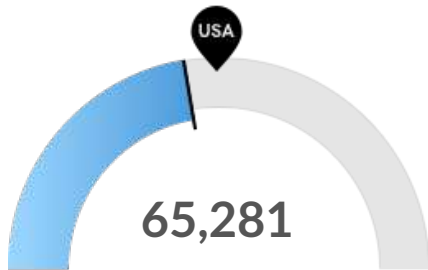

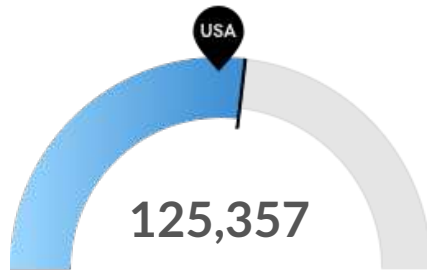

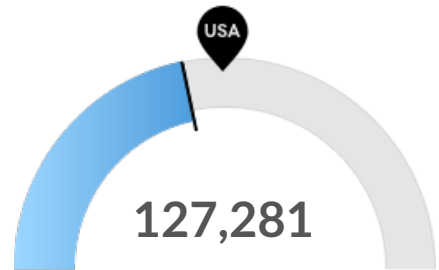
Millennials

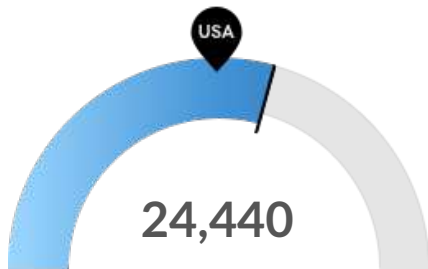
Retiring Soon

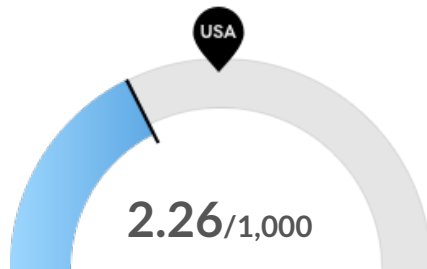

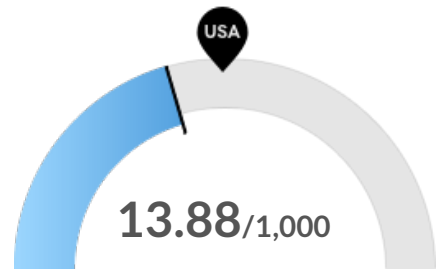

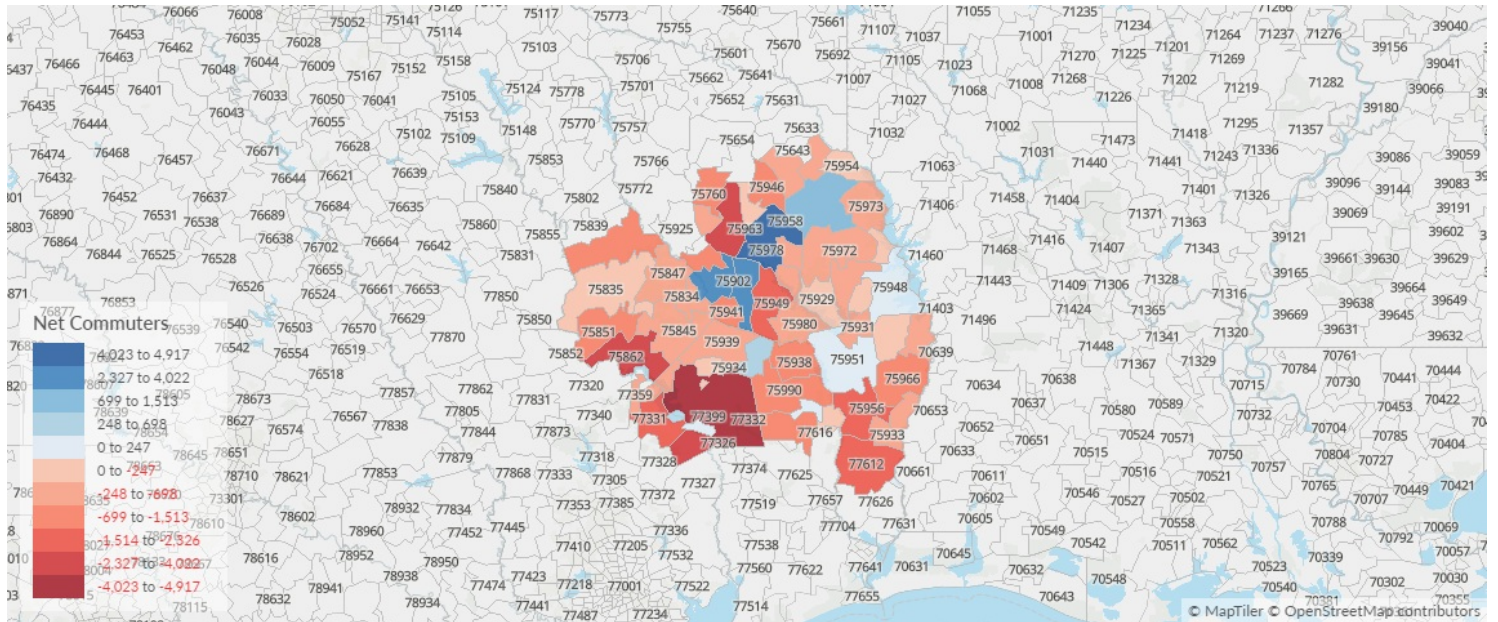

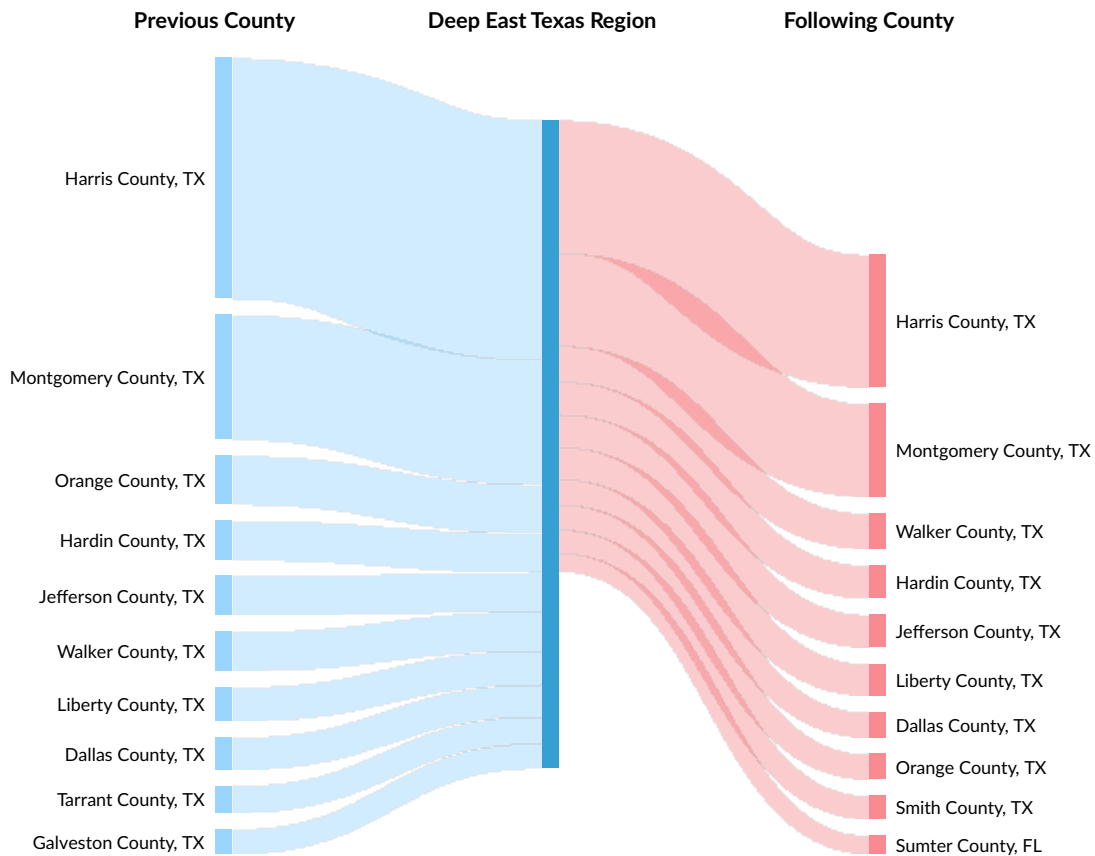

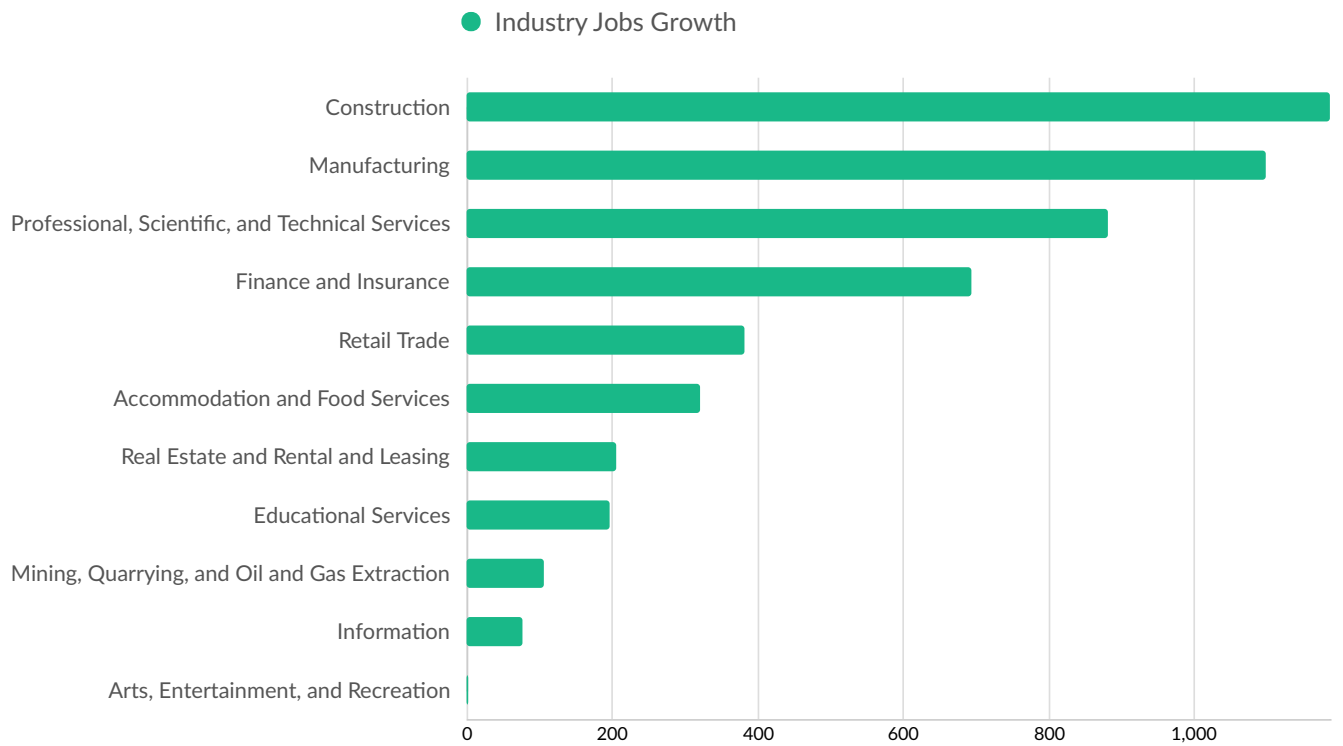

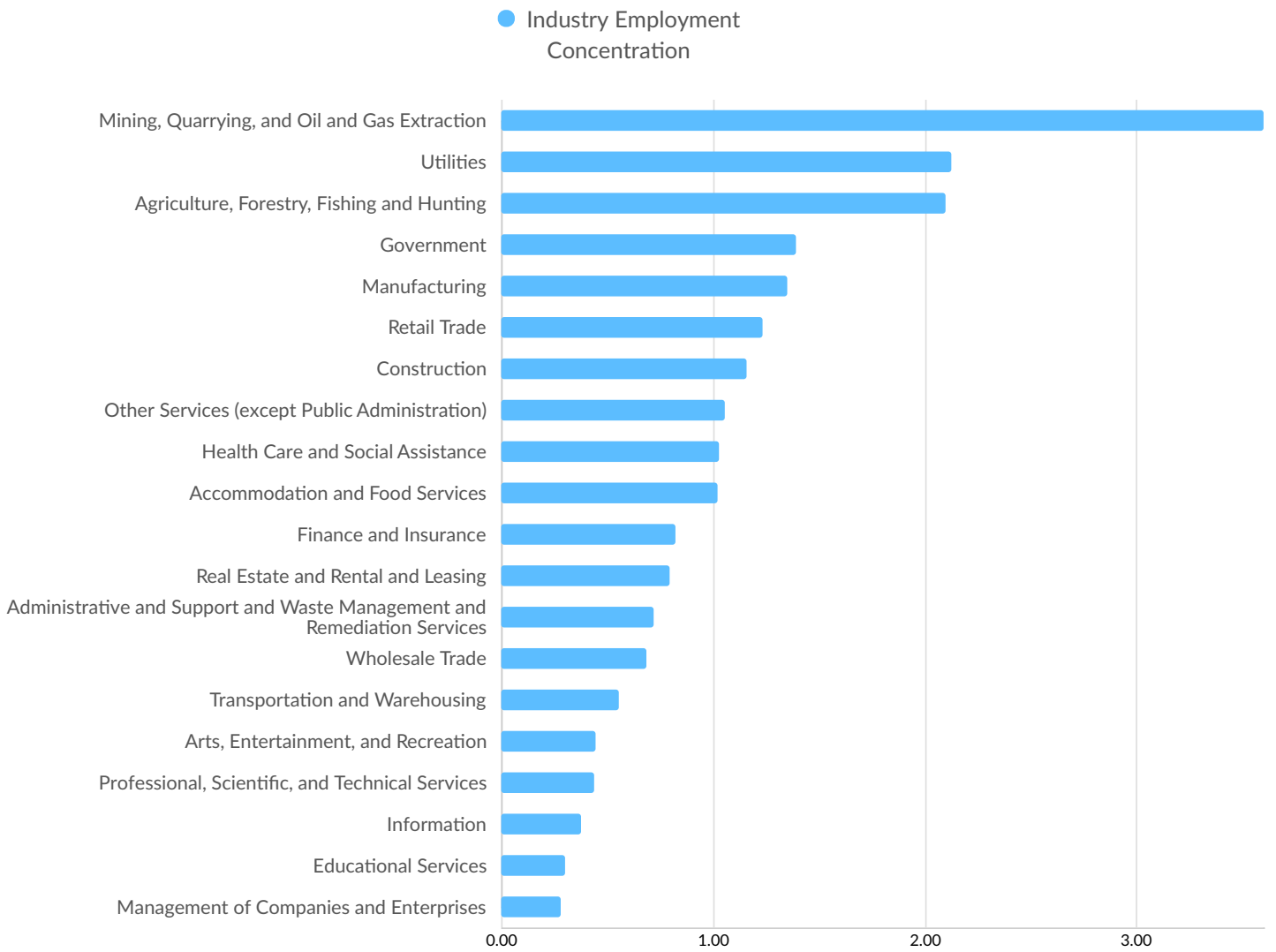

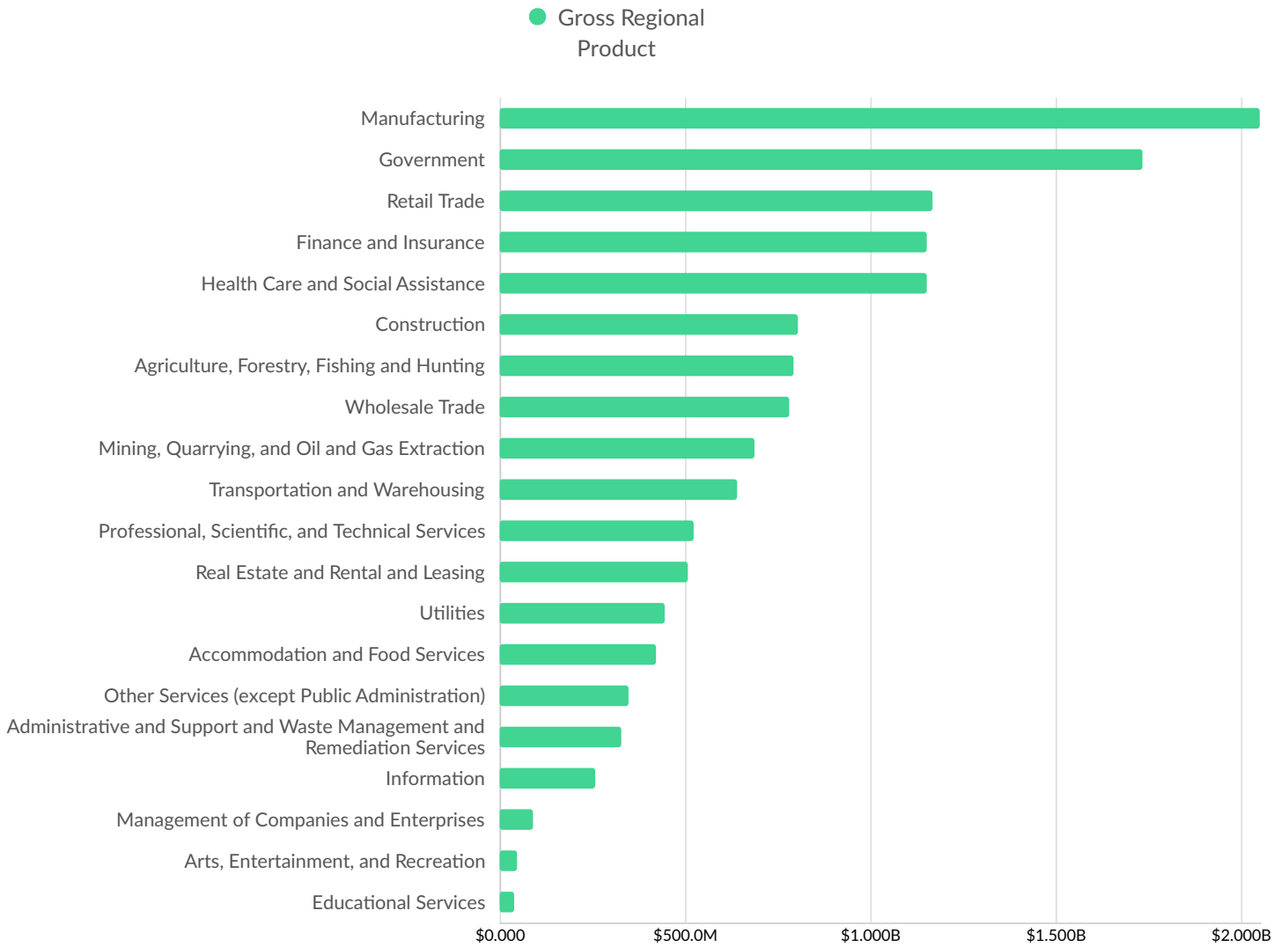
Top Growing Industries



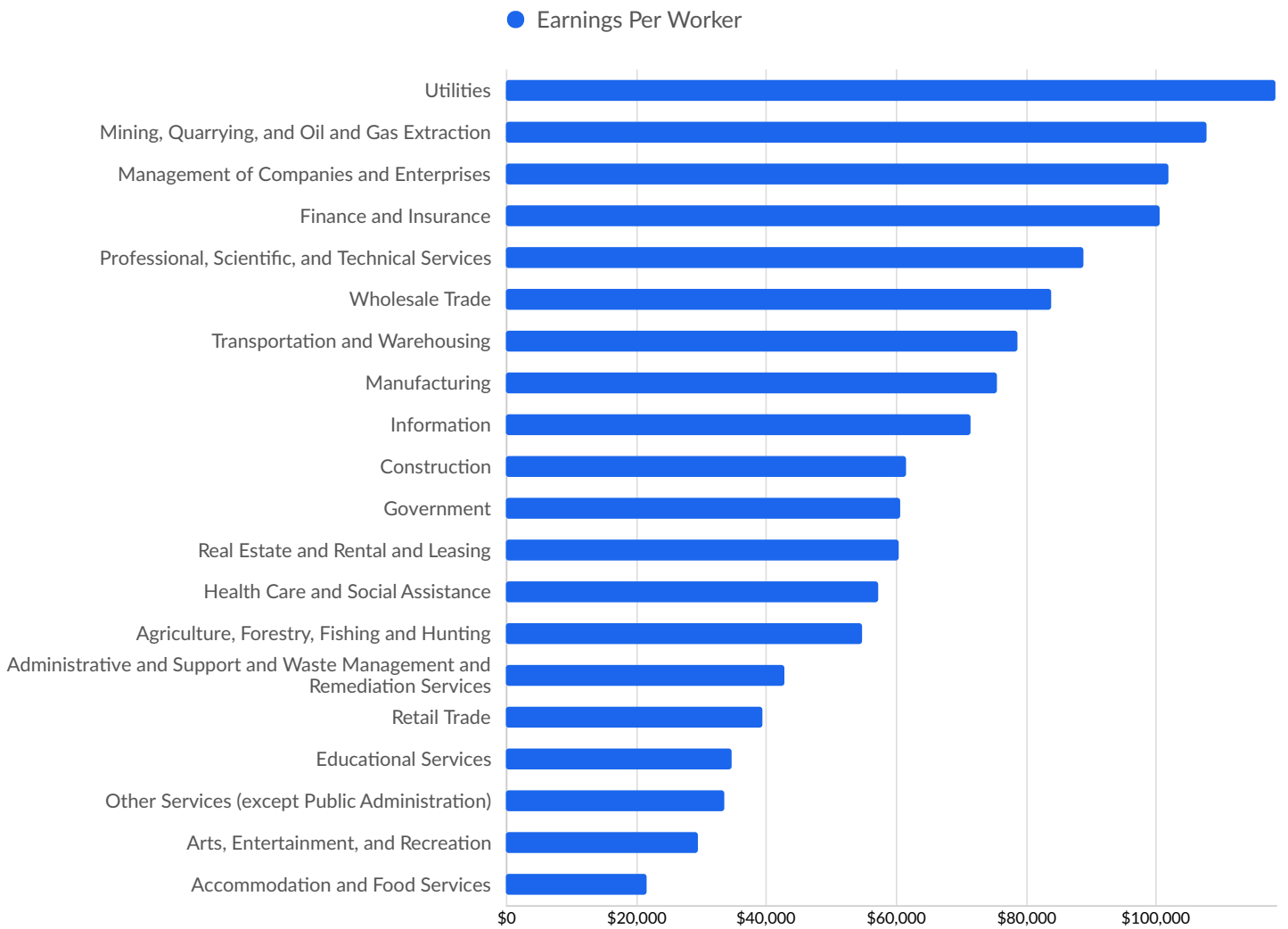
Top Industry Employment Concentration

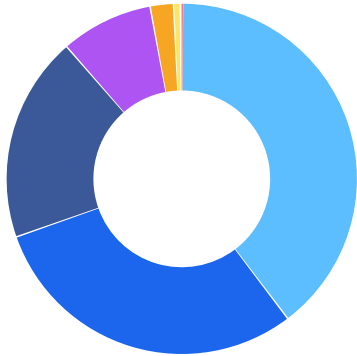

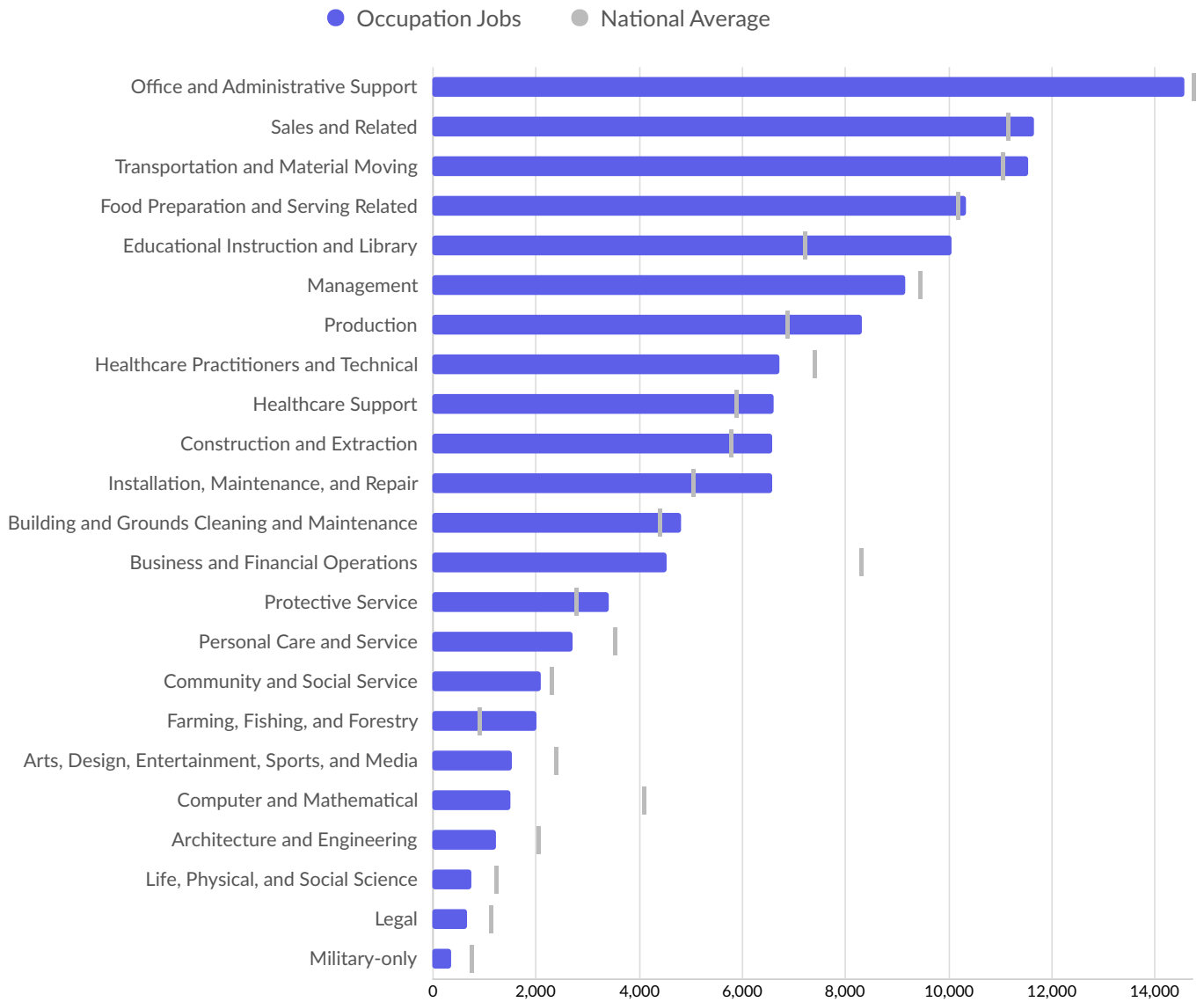

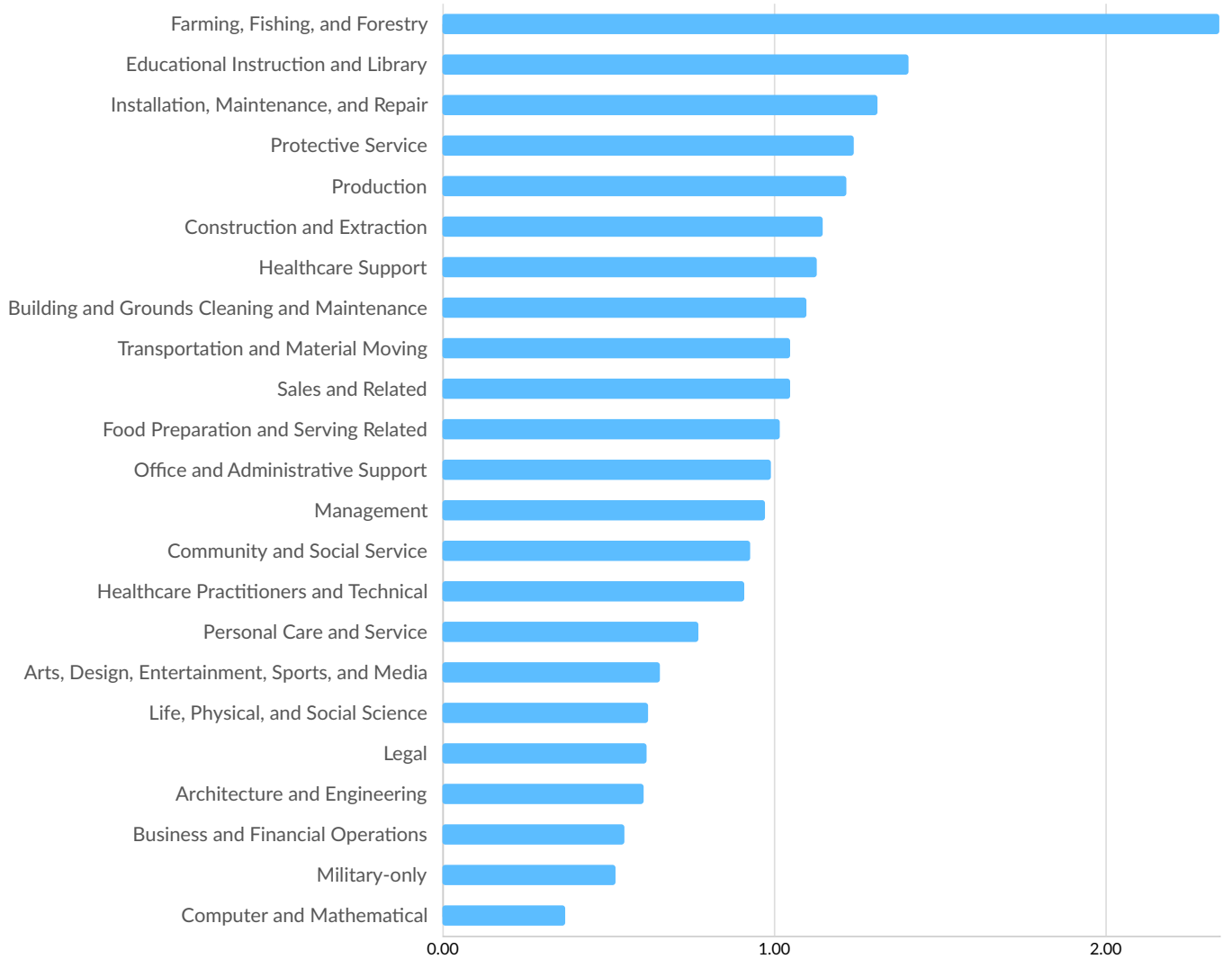


Top Growing Occupations



Top Occupation Employment Concentration

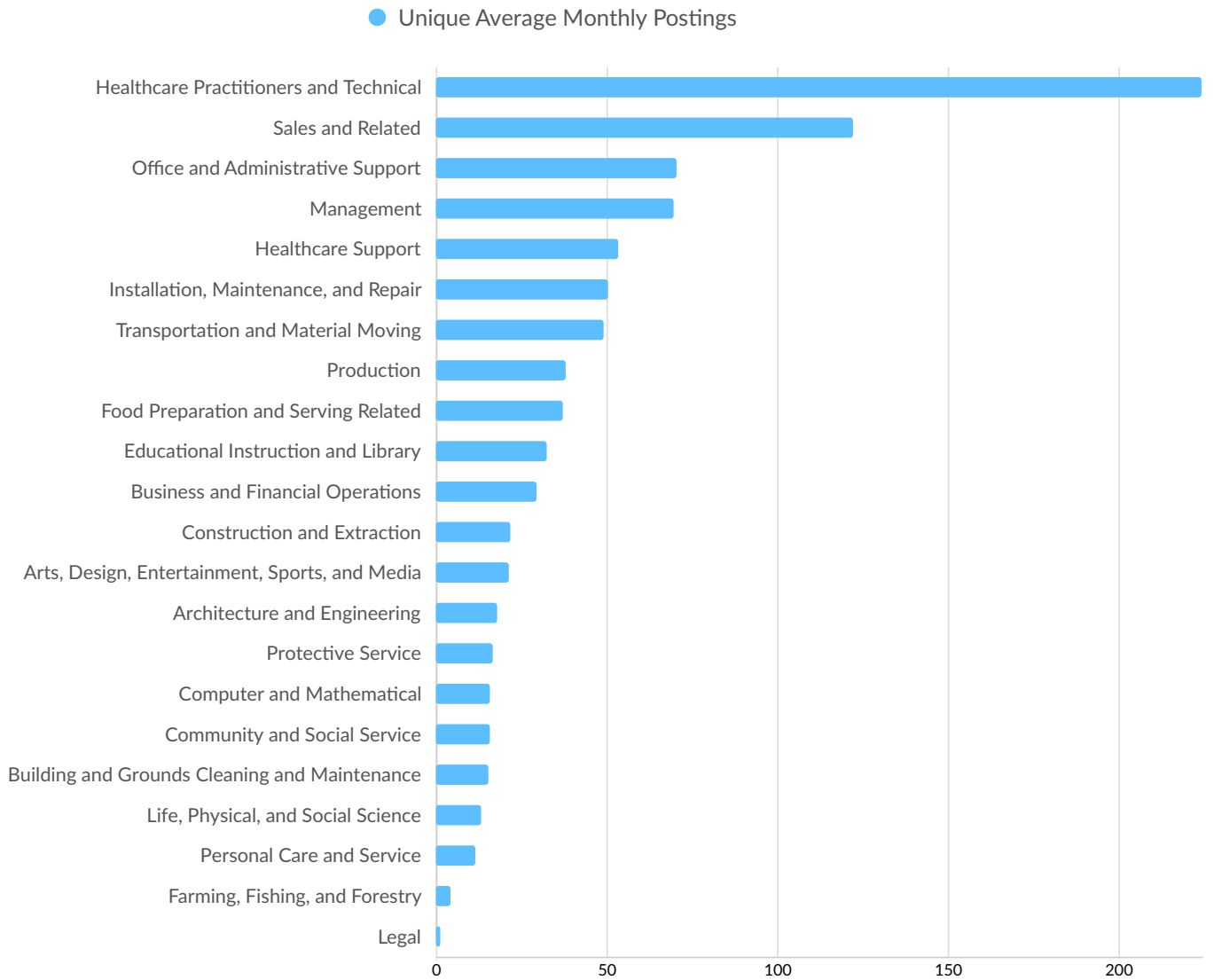

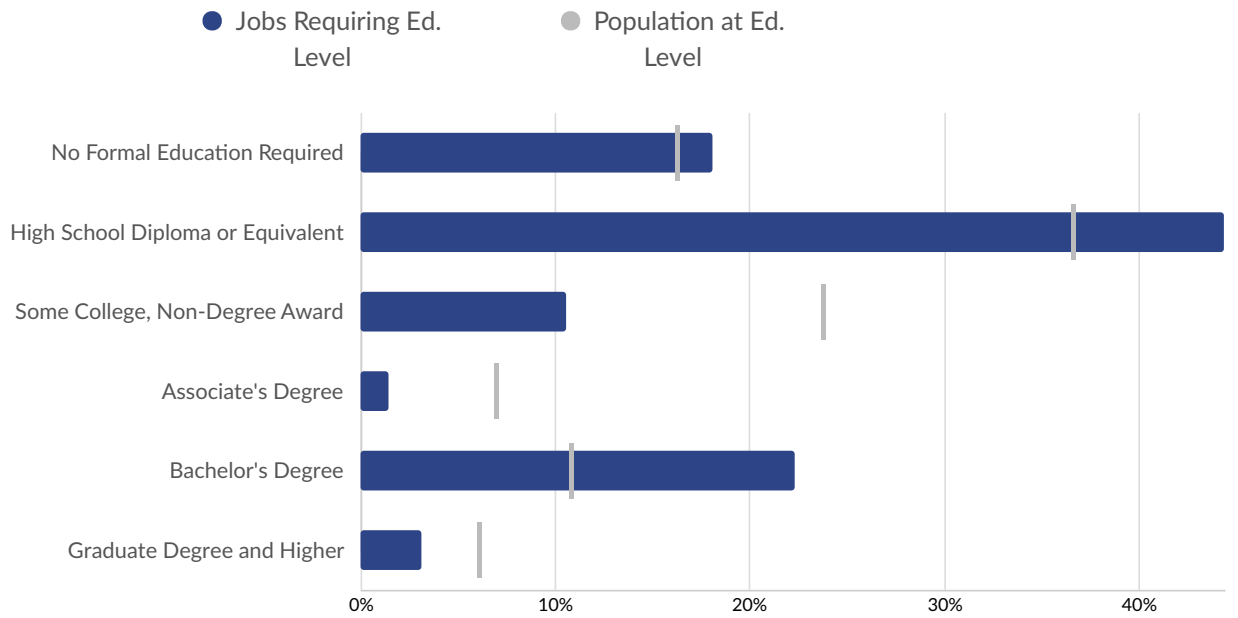
Top Occupation Earnings

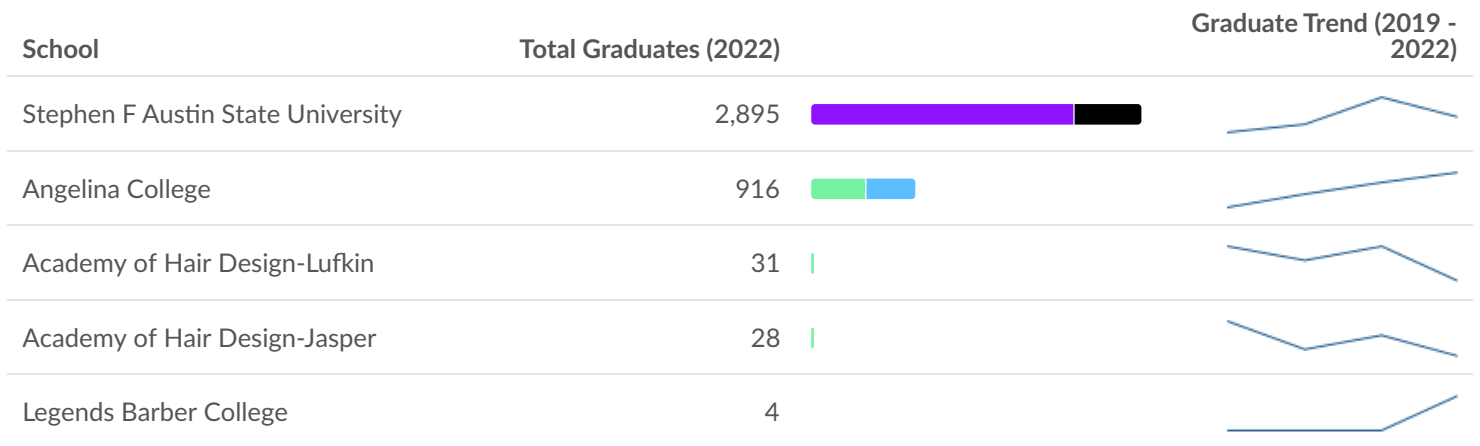

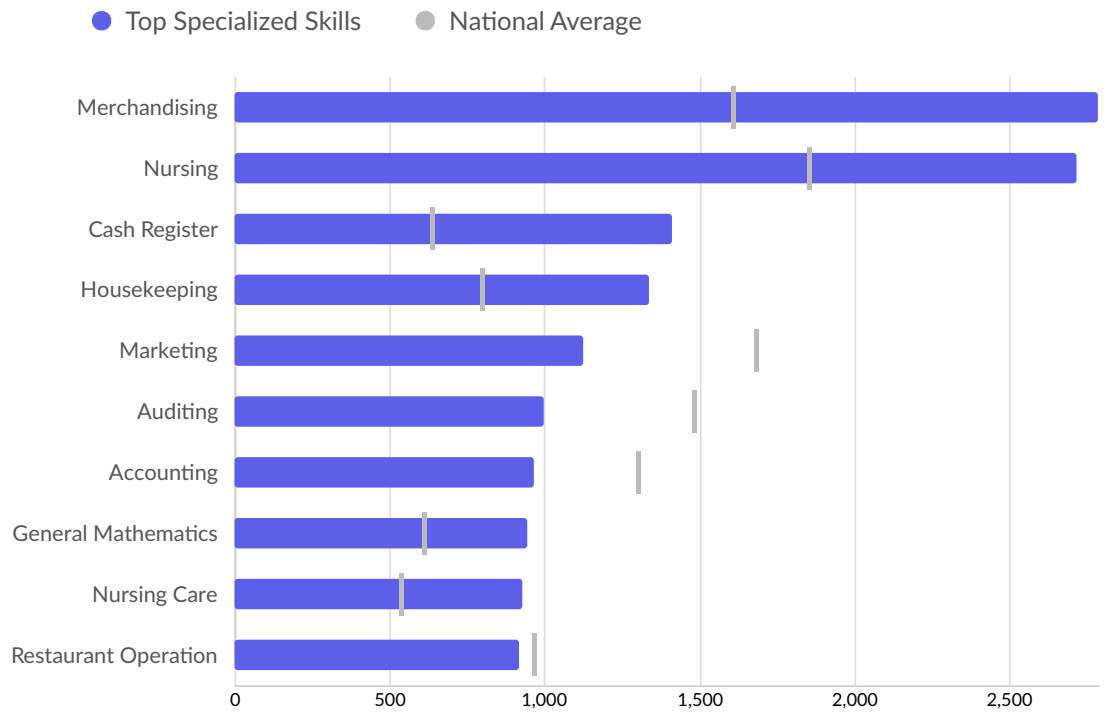
Educational Pipeline
